The Lot Valley Slopes

At the confluence of changeable rivers, the Lot and the Truyère, the pretty town of Entraygues is set beneath forested slopes, vineyards and heath.

- 1 From the tourist office take the main street down to the Quay du Lot, and then go along the river, in the Rodez direction, up to the Pontet Chapel (*whose name derives from "little bridge"*).
- 2 Turn left, follow the stream that flows under the pretty little bridge, then walk up to the hamlet of Limousines.
- 3 Keep on this narrow road that rises up the hillside and after 600 meters you will be among vineyards just before you reach the hamlet of Méjanasserre. (*gallic-roman remains at the entrance: granite sarcophagus against the garden wall; two others serve as a trough at the village spring*).
- 4 Take the little track on the right (*between the houses*) and go down through chestnut woods. Cross a small stream. Go up to rejoin the road of Prévinquières. Follow it on the left for one km, overlooking the village and the Lot Valley up to a point close to the D42. Then take the right diagonal on the rialles track, bordered with cherry trees, up to the house.
- 5 Keep going through the woods up to the Tours stream, then go up into the holly trees. Then take the road on the right and go down to Montcausson (*ancient site of a castelany-13th 14th century Castle*). Above a door a stone shell frames a bust of a woman dating from 1593.
- 6 Go through the hamlet. Continue straight ahead on an earthen path where, in the middle of the valley, rises the village of Castailhac. Keep on through the wood; at the intersection of two tracks, take the one on the right. Lower down, cross the Tour stream. Go up again, obliquely to the left, for 500 meters through the box trees as far as Prévinquières (*chapel ruins, two windows in the farm yard and, lower down, an old quarry*).

- 7 As an alternative (*to avoid the D920 for 1.5km*) take the track on the right that leads up to Méjanasserre. Follow the tiny road down into the valley, and then take the D920, on the right, to Entraygues.
