



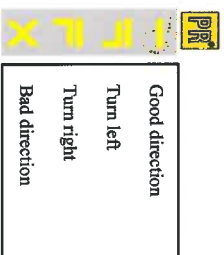

The Village of Crestes

La Borie de Cayron

Following the ridge that overlooks The Lot Valley, we shall come to Crestes, a hamlet beyond this world at the end of this magnificent walk.

Overlooking the Lot Valley, the Fel is a village notable for its beautiful old restored buildings. Built on a narrow ridge, it still has a small tower, a remnant of an ancient castle.

Formerly, the culture of the vine was thriving and layered in terraces on the slopes overlooking the Lot and towards Vieilleville and Entraygues. Since then, many of the vineyards have disappeared, but today they bloom again. Do not leave without tasting its wines and cabécous (goat cheese). They will delight your palate.

- 1 From the Mairie, go down to the village. After the hotel-restaurant and before the tower, turn left towards the beautiful views of the vineyards and the Lot Valley. Keep right on a vineyard track passing below the houses and camping ground up to the road. Go up to the right for 100 m. Opposite the tennis court, take the carral (path in the wood) that goes down (left) to the Félique farm. Continue the descent on the tarmac path through the vineyard and up to the road.
- 2 Follow it (right) for 150 m. At a sharp bend, fork to the right on the earth track. Take this track (valley views) up to Cabrières farm. Take the little road (right) and pass above the farm for 150 m. Then, on a tight bend, leave the road and follow a track, opposite for 150 m. At the first crossroad take (right) a pleasant carral for 1.8 km, to come back to Creste. As you come out on to the road, go (left) up to the village under restoration (chapel visit). Go back to the crossroad at the Camin d'Olt junction.
- 3 Go up to the chapel and take the first little road leading up to La Borie de Cayron (as you go up, view the wild ravine and Le Fel village along the ridge).
- 4 Begin by taking the Camin d'Olt (earthy track) to the stream. Go up again (right) along a plantation of chestnut trees. Take the main road (left) up to the parking area.
